We have booked Whalley Abbey again, the dates are Monday 28th & Tuesday 29th September, cost including all meals is £80.00 – please see Edith for full details.

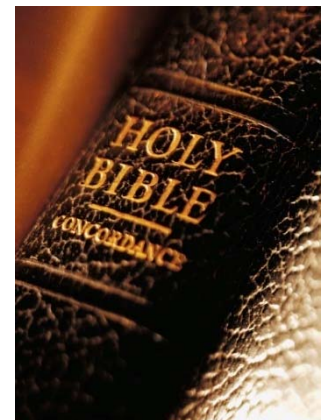
John 4 v 34
